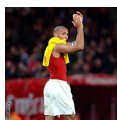

The Season so far ...

Wakehurst's pre-season may not have been impressive as far as results go, but Manager Neil Candlish was never in any doubt that the team was moving in the right direction. The friendly at Ballymena seemed to gel the team, who didn't look out of place against their more illustrious neighbours, going in one nil up in the first half thanks to a wonder strike by the ever improving Stephen McIlroy.

The first competitive match saw Wakehurst defeat Lurgan Celtic away from home, and had the opposition manager, Pat McGibbon, praising Wakehurst and how well they played. Wakehurst found themselves one nil down in the first half but a great move and cross involving Ricky Mellon saw the Lurgan Celtic defender put the ball into his own net to make it 1-1. Wakehurst stepped up the pace and the pressure paid off when Connor Warren found himself in the opposing teams six yard box. With his back to goal and the ball at his feet he calmly back heeled it into the net to make it 2-1. In the second half Wakehurst kept up the pace and a move involving Scott Drummond, Ryan Lyness and Paul Boreland ended with Drummond scoring the third. A 30 yard Dwyer Hill strike made it a bit more interesting near the end but the visiting side held on to go top of the table.

On Saturday, Wakehurst who were missing several players lost to Banbridge Town who scored two late goals. Wakehurst were left ruing a couple of early chances which fell to defender Roy Colville, who is renowned more for his tough tackling and steely determination rather than his prowess in the box. Hopefully Neil will have a full squad to choose from tonight and will look to get Wakehurst back on track in Group A.

Wakehurst met Ards this time last year and lost 4-1 at Clondeboyne with Scott Drummond getting the consolation. The team did well taking into account that they had no manager at that time. Neale Kirk and Willie Allen kept the club ticking over until Ian Gregg was coaxed back in whilst a suitable replacement was found. Last years match report is on page 12.

WAKEHURST manager Neil Candlish will welcome back three key players for an important week of action in two cup competitions.

The Hurst boss will have defender Peter Stevenson, midfielder Ricky Mellon and striker Scott Drummond back in contention for the Showgrounds side's third Carnegie Cup group match at home to Ards this Thursday night (6.45pm) and then an intriguing Steel and Sons Cup tie against Ballymena and Provincial Intermediate League neighbours Clough Rangers Athletic on Saturday, again at the Warden Street venue.

"I'm really looking forward to this week," Candlish told Times Sport.

"It'll be good to pit my wits against Tommy Kincaid when we play Ards because he is a close friend of mine who really set me on the road to coaching and management – it'll be interesting to see if the student can put one over on the master!

"Then on Saturday it's a local 'derby' in the Steel and Sons. Clough actually beat us 1-0 in pre-season and while the result didn't matter then, that's clearly not the case this time because we want to try to have a run in the Steel and Sons.

"I'll be glad to have those three players back because we were really down to the bare bones on Saturday, when we lost 2-0 at Banbridge.

"I was only able to name one sub – Ryan Gregg – and he's only just back in training after injury. It was the same with Stevie Mellon who made his first appearance of the season after only going back to training last week.

"It's that time of the season when you can still have players unavailable through holidays and work commitments. I have to say a special word about Connor Warren who has been working long shifts during the week and who only finished

work at 9.30 on Saturday morning, had a couple of hours' sleep, played well for us and then headed off to work again.

"Once again on Saturday I was really pleased with how we played because Banbridge finished third in the first division last season and we gave them a real game – they didn't score until five minutes from the end and then got their second when we were chasing the game.

"We should actually have been two goals ahead inside the opening 10 minutes when Roy Colville missed a couple of headers but again, it was moves we had worked on in training which is pleasing.

On the half hour, A few minutes later, Wakehurst should have opened the scoring when Kenny Neilly pounced on a poor back pass and having beaten the goalkeeper just couldn't find the net.

On 68 minutes, the main talking point of the match occurred. Banbridge appeared to open the scoring, following the award of an indirect free kick in the penalty box, after the referee adjudged Keith Wilson had handled a back pass from defender Connor Warren. The referee initially gave the goal but then changed his mind and gave a by-ball.

Banbridge were having most of the play and on 86 minutes, they got the breakthrough when Evans beat his marker, cut inside and with an inch perfect cross found the head of John Joe Maguire who made no mistake to make it 1-0.

Unfortunately for Wakehurst, in pushing for an equaliser, they left themselves vulnerable at the back and with a minute of the game remaining, Aaron Baker squared the ball to Shane McGeown who made it 2-0 and sealed the home side's fate.

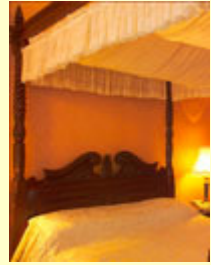

Today's Visitors



Wakehurst would like to welcome the players, staff and supporters of **Ards FC** to the showgrounds tonight. This is the second year running that Wakehurst and Ards have been drawn together in the Carnegie League Cup. Ards ran out 4-1 winners last time round at Clondeboyne with Scott Drummond getting a consolation goal. The scorers for Ards that day were Ryan Tumelty, Aaron McKee and Craig McCracken. The only one left being McKee who is now club captain. Former Ards goalkeeper Neale Kirk,

who has been goalkeeping coach at Wakehurst for several seasons was in the sticks that day due to injury to AJ Mitchel and Keith Wilsons departure to Larne.

Ards were formed in 1902 and played their first senior game in 1923. Their greatest triumph, which is being commemorated with a new 50 year anniversary crest, was the clubs one and only league title. Along with their four trophy haul in 1974 this stands out as the greatest moment in the clubs history. Ards were faced with massive debts in 1988 and were forced to sell their ground. Because of this they play their home matches at Bangor.

Ards were relegated to the First Division two years ago but hope to make a return to the top flight under the stewardship of Tommy Kincaid. The ex-player who dazzled with his skills on the flank has built up a strong side, bringing in Andy McDonald and Darren Nixon. Kincaid has been in management long enough and knows what is required to get out of the First division, a feat he accomplished at Larne a few seasons back. Spells at East Belfast, Glenavon and Glentoran as well as Distillery means that Kincaid is one of the most experienced managers in the division and will surely make Ards real contenders to rejoin the top flight next year.

Having beaten Lurgan Celtic last week Ards leapfrogged Wakehurst into top spot due to the 2-0 defeat at home to Banbridge on Saturday. Darren Stirling grabbed a brace and Ricky Billing (pictured right) sealed it with a thumping header. The previous week saw James Wilson and Aaron McKee score late on to seal all three points against a determined Queens side. A win for Ards tonight will end the group as a contest but the group will be wide open should Wakehurst cause an upset tonight. Wakehurst manager Neil Candlish, who has played at the highest level and who won a championship medal at Portadown, still rates his promotion at Larne under Tommy as one of his greatest achievements. Candlish joined Kincaid at Glenavon but due to a recurring knee injury could no longer compete at that level. Two managers who know each other so well, will no doubt want to get one over on each other and will settle for nothing less than a win from their sides. Hopefully it will add up to an exciting match.



Ones to Watch



Andy McDonald

Position : Goalkeeper

Age : 30

Previous Clubs : Larne, Balyclare Comrades, Distillery, Glenavon, East Belfast

Andy is arguably the best keeper in the First Division. He has played under Tommy Kincaid now for several years and at several clubs. Tommy brought Andy to Larne and together they won promotion to the top flight. Since then, Andy has played at Glenavon, East Belfast and now Ards with Kincaid. A character on and off the pitch Andy is the life and soul of any club lucky enough to acquire his services. Anyone who can do a one handed press-up whilst smoking a cigar is definitely one to watch! ;-)

Darren Nixon

Position : Right-Back

Age : 25

Previous Clubs : Glentoran, Carrick Rangers, Dundela

Darren spent three seasons with Ards between 1999 and 2003, making over 100 appearances. He won a First Division championship medal in 2001 and is the nephew of Ards seventies legend Billy Nixon. Darren rejoined Ards from Dundela and is another quality signing for Tommy. Darren can play at right back or centre half and is very adept at coming out of the defence with the ball and causing teams problems further up the pitch. Likes a tackle too.

Justin McBride

Position : Forward

Age : 35

Previous Clubs : Carrick Rangers, Glentoran, Linfield, Ballymena United

A player who has been there and done it at the highest level in the Irish League. Justin McBride may be pushing on in years but there is no doubting the quality the diminutive striker possesses. He has taken the assistant managers role at Ards now but is very much still capable of producing a display on the field as well as passing on his wealth of experience to the younger players off it. On his day would no doubt cause problems for any team in the league.



Ones to Watch



Johnny Shaw

Position : Right Back/Centre Midfield
Age : 28
Previous Clubs : Linfield, Crusaders, PSNI

One of the emerging youngsters at Linfield in the late nineties Johnny Shaw could probably be called a veteran, even though he is only 28. Johnny moved onto Crusaders and had several good seasons at Seaview. Johnny already has a goal against Wakehurst, in the County Antrim Shield back in 2000 when Linfield won 8-0. Good on the ball will probably spend more time in the opposing half than in his own, though hopefully will be required to show his defending capabilities tonight.



Aaron McKee

Position : Centre-Midfield
Age : 24
Previous Clubs : Bangor, Linfield, Crusaders, Stirling Lions

Coupled with a spell in Australia recently, Aaron McKee boasts an impressive CV having played for Linfield and Crusaders. A native of Newtownards, McKee is the lynchpin of the midfield and has quite a bit of flair and as such was awarded three best player awards last season. The club captain, he has represented Northern Ireland at under 18 level.



Tommy Kincaid

Position : Manager
Age : Confidential
Previous Clubs as Manager : Larne, Distillery, Glenavon, Glentoran, East-Belfast

There is little chance of Tommy Kincaid taking to the field tonight, although in training he can still play a bit and will no doubt confirm that he indeed made Stephen Baxter with his pinpoint crosses. Tommy has over ten years experience in management and one of his many successes includes promotion at Larne. Larne were beaten 8-2 in their final game of the season before Tommy took over but managed to rebuild the club and in two seasons were promoted. Tonight he lines up against a manager who he signed for Larne and Glenavon but will no doubt, like Neil Candlish, put friendship on the back burner for 90 minutes.

Ards 4-1 Wakehurst

19th August 2006

This win over Wakehurst at Clondeboye today was a massive confidence booster for Ards, who fielded a makeshift side due to a serious injury crisis.

In the end the scoreline made the encounter appear very one-sided, but it must be noted that Wakehurst had their share of chances, while Ards looked very weak at the back on occasions.

Neither Brendan Ward or Johnny Shaw passed fitness tests to play and with Jay Magee serving his suspension that meant a untried defence of Rees, Smith, Roy and Rutherford. The return of Craig McCracken meant Ryan Tumelty dropped back into midfield at the expense of Ian McGrath, while Jeff McNamara was employed in a holding role just in front of the defence.

The fine Bangor weather attracted a healthy crowd for the first Ards home game of the season and whatever number of travelling supporters were in attendance they would have seen their side have the first chance. A misplaced pass by Robert Smith on ten minutes inadvertently laid the ball into the path of Irvin who was smartly denied when Ian Mannus raced out to the edge of his area to block.

A minute later and Ards grabbed the lead with the first of several good strikes. A nice take down and some neat footwork by Craig McCracken culminated in a short lay-off for Ryan Tumelty and he volleyed in from five yards. Five minutes after that and Aaron McKee saw his low shot from 20 yards skip past an upright.

Wakehurst were causing problems for Ards, who all too often had trouble dealing with things at the back. Nothing the visitors were creating came too close to a goal however, and it was still Ards who were making the better chances. A 39th minute header from McKee seemed to be locked on target only for the attempted flick on by Tumelty to instead send the ball over the bar. And then a couple of minutes to the break Justin McBride fired a shot just wide after a loose ball had spun away from McCracken.

A last minute shot from Mulholland had just sailed over the Ards crossbar and Wake-

hurst did put their mark on the game just five minutes after the restart. Some slack marking by Ards made light work for Wakehurst and when the ball was nodded on inside the six yard box there was Scott Drummond to head in an equaliser.

The goal might have been a sucker punch for the Ards side but instead they stepped their game up and produced a series of great chances over the next half hour. A free kick from captain McKee on 54 minutes set up Ryan Newbury to clip a shot off the bar and then after Wakehurst had missed a great one-on-one chance Ards re-took the lead just before the hour mark. A cross into the area found the head of Smith and his knock-down was stabbed home by the lurking Tumelty for his second of the day.

Ards then struck the bar twice in two minutes; the first incident seeing McCracken skillfully turn a couple of Wakehurst defenders before thumping his strike off the face of the visitors' goal, and then a 66th minute header from Tumelty ended with the same outcome.

Ards stretched their lead and put to bed any hopes of a Wakehurst recovery with two more goals in six minutes starting with a powerful 20 yard strike from McKee on 69 minutes after some interchange play between McBride and McCracken. The best goal of the match was to follow though when McCracken confounded everyone's expectations after going a yard in the clear on the edge of the Wakehurst area by delightfully chipping over the head of a stranded Neale Kirk. What a way to re-open your Ards account.

The goalkeeper redeemed himself well on 86 minutes however when an instinctive leg-block denied Tumelty a hat-trick following the teenager's mazy run through the area.

Ryan Lyness

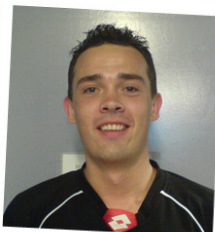

Portglenone, Broadway Star, Waveny Swifts, Galgorm Blues Old Bleach, Connor, Nelsons, Tobermore, Moyola Park, Cookstown Utd, Maghera Reds to name but a few!(editor:“Johnny wanted everyone to know he scored on his debut for all of the above!”)

How many games did you play for wakehurst?

Roughly a hundred

How many goals did you score for wakehurst?

70, most of them with headers! (editor : “Aye right”)

Who is the best player you have played with?

Played with so many good players at different levels but would highlight Tommy Smyth, David Kenny, Ray Starrett, Kenny Shiels and Scotty Drummond (editor : “Drummond denies being old enough to have played with Johnny but Weir didn't retire until 52 so he may have”) who all played for Ballymena Utd at some stage as well as other Irish League Senior and 'B' Division clubs.

Who is the best player you have ever played against?

Marty Quinn(Cliftonville), Alan Frazer (Linfield), Sammy Lunn (Portadown), Ray Collins (Moyola Park).

What was your typical pre-match meal?

Toast and Beans and sometimes a 99, Friday night was a fish supper and a few pints, only joking about the pints, I was a modellet me finish professional.

What did you do on a Saturday night if you won?

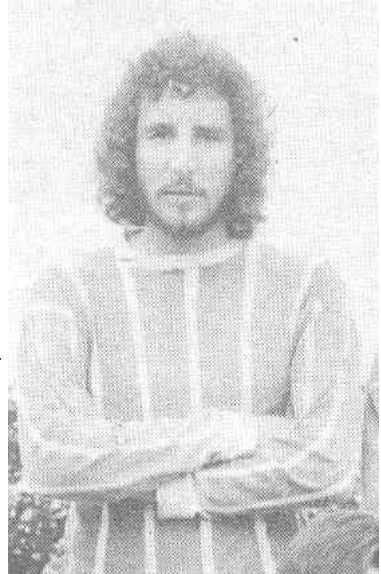
Got blocked

Who was your favourite player in 1977?

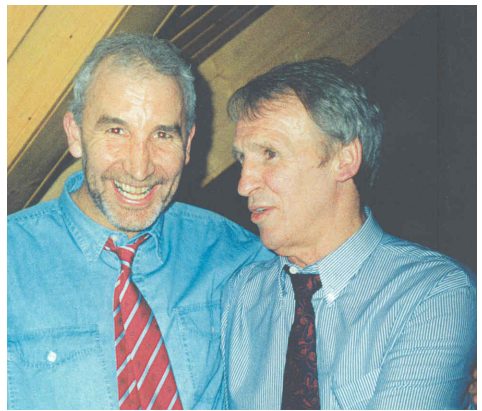

Funniest thing you have heard on the pitch?

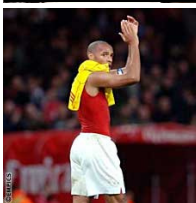
